How Should Arlington do It?

- County leaders say "we are not doing Minneapolis," but have not defined outcomes
- County leaders say we need a "new type of housing" but not why, where, what types, and for whom
- County leaders cannot demonstrate if/how MM promotes affordability
- County leaders have not indicated MM impact on schools, parks, roads, services, taxes
- ASF seeks an objective comprehensive study, including no upzoning if merited

Arlington Short Timeline

- Irreversible Change

<u>3 phases</u> – "building understanding, focused study, implementation"

- MM announced Dec 17 board meeting
- Resident survey and county board briefings March 2020
- Kickoff April 2020
- Process through late 2021

(Updated at 3:45 p.m.) A large water transmission main serving Arlington ruptured early this morning amid falling temperatures, prompting major closures.

The water main break was first reported around 4:30 a.m. on the Arlington side of Chain Bridge. The northern end of N. Glebe Road, a portion of Chain Bridge Road and Chain Bridge itself were all expected to remain closed throughout the morning rush hour as a result.

OUR LOCAL ECOSYSTEMS UNDER PRESSURE: FLOODING, SHRINKING NATURAL RESOURCES

- 45% impervious surfaces on land in Arlington
- 9 acres of permeable surface lost every year
- Development adds impervious surfaces the size of the Pentagon every 3-4 years.
- Vegetation and tree loss increases runoff
- With climate change increased vulnerability to flooding and heat island effect

How Would County Accelerated Development Square with Preserving Crucial Natural Resources in Climate Change Environment?

Ask Arlington County to:

- State the goals and rationale
 - Why need more "types" and more people?
 - What is "Missing Middle" Income level?
 - How achieve Affordable or MM Housing in this market?
- Publish effects of MM programs adopted elsewhere, particularly budget, infrastructure, and environmental impacts
- Solicit and publish meaningful citizen input rather than artificial "surveys" that assume the "need for something" to be done
- Avoid accelerated development until we have answers
