Demolition Continues at the former VHC site

County contractors are now actively disassembling the former Virginia Hospital Center (VHC) building on Carlin Springs Road.

Many neighbors remember this as the Doctors' Hospital before it was purchased by VHC. It was used as an emergency center, pediatric clinic and a privately run daycare center before a county/VHC land swap in 2017.

Phase 1 of the deconstruction included decoupling from the office building at 611 S. Carlin Springs Road, which was completed in late Summer 2022. Phase 2 began in November 2022 and includes demolition of the former hospital building.

Expect construction noise, trucks entering and existing the site, and building demolition. Please stay outside of the fenced construction area and obey all traffic signals around the site. Arlington Neighborhoods (AN) Program Update

4th St. S. Project is now complete!

Street trees and replacement plants have been installed. With this final step, the project is complete.

Three Invasive Treatments Remain for Kenmore Wooded Area Project

IPC, the invasive control contractor hired by Arlington County, will complete the three remaining treatments during summer and fall of 2023, and summer of 2024. Signs will be posted when the treatments occur and the area being treated will be safe to enter.

Wetland Studies and Solutions, a consulting firm hired by the county, has completed a tree survey. The plan is to evaluate existing trees for removal, pruning or retention once the invasive treatments are complete.

The rest of the project is contingent on the availability of engineering staff to design the remaining items in the draft plan. An engineer on the team left the county in late 2022 and the impact on the project's schedule is yet to be determined.

Once the design information is available, there will be refinement of the draft plan, as was anticipated when the project was approved and funded. Some items that GCA proposed may need to go into a future AN project or be pursued by collaboration between APS and GCA. As the plan is refined, more information will be provided about the scope of the project.

View from the Garden

Did the few days of spring-like weather that welcomed the New Year coax you out of the house and into the garden to pull a few weeds, rake the last leaves off your lawn, remove spent foliage, maybe to begin dreaming about springtime and harvests to come? It did me, but, alas, it was a relief when the cold temperatures returned. As a gardener, winter is not only a much-needed time to rest, it is a time for quieter pursuits that help prepare for the burst of activity that lasts from early March to late November. It is a wonderful time to learn about gardening, at one's own pace and without the pressure of a long to-do list.

To support and encourage public education on gardening, the Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia have created a treasure trove of more than 100 online classes and videos covering a wide variety of topics, including seed starting, creating a climate resilient landscape, and selecting native groundcovers for sun and shade. We offer more than 30 short, how-to videos on garden practices and a series of inspirational videos set to music. All classes and videos can be easily accessed and watched free-of-charge.

To view the offerings, go to https://mgnv.org. At the top of the page, click on Education, then scroll down to and click on the Master Gardener Virtual Classroom link. Along the left-hand side of the Virtual Classroom page, you will find links to dozens of subjects listed in alphabetical order, beginning with Composting and ending with Wildlife. Click on an area of interest and select one of the offerings.

A number of winter-oriented classes and videos created by Glencarlyn Library Garden co-coordinators are perfect for this time of year, including a virtual master class on "Native Plants for Winter Interest" with Elaine Mills; short videos on "Cutting

Back Hellebores and Epimedium" and "Winter Weeds" with Judy Funderburk; "Winter Pruning" with Paul Nuhn; "Cutting Back Native Plants" with Wendy Mills; and a series of videos set to music that showcase "Beautiful Native Plants" produced by Alyssa Ford Morel.

MGNV's collection of videos is constantly growing. Glencarlyn co-coordinators Elaine Mills and Alyssa Ford Morel are planning a new video series in 2023 about alternatives to commonly used invasive plants, such as English Ivy, Nandina, and Burning Bush.

During the growing season gardeners learn by doing. In the winter, we have greater opportunities to think, read and plan. Check out the MGNV website and indulge your interests, get answers to your questions, and learn best practices that will enhance your gardening efforts once spring comes.

Glencarlyn's Wheels to Africa: Twenty Years Strong

As you walk down Kensington Street, heading north from the library, you'll see a house with a growing collection of bikes parked in the driveway. And, suddenly, all the bicycles are gone. Many neighbors wonder what's going on here? Where did they go?

Here's the story of Wheels to Africa—a non-profit group founded by Glencarlynite Dixie Duncan and her son, Winston.

Wheels to Africa (WTA) is a local, all volunteer non-profit that is supported by the community. Wheels to Africa also serves as an educational and volunteer platform for American youth to develop leaderships skills through civic engagement.

In 2005, a bike collection at Nottingham Elementary School with 10 student volunteers brought in 124 bicycles. The event was a huge success and Wheels to Africa was born. The next year, a bike collection at Yorktown High School netted 205 bikes. Since that time there have been 37 bike collections and 14,500 bikes collected for needy communities. As many as 85,000 lives have been changed in Africa, and over 3,240 American volunteers touched by WTA!

Of the 10 students who participated in the first collection, six have been to Africa to work on a college or high school project. Many of the volunteers have participated year after year and feel like they "own" a part of "Wheels to Africa." It is essential that we share our story because we have the potential to inspire thousands and continue to motivate individuals to change lives.

Since 2014, Dixie Duncan has been leading a groups or youth volunteers for service in Africa. The volunteers experience includes teaching English, working on bicycles, and visiting with locals so upon the return to the USA you have experienced events that will change your life.

In 2018, three Washington DC youth volunteers, traveled to Ghana, Tanzania, and Zanzibar to distribute bicycles and document the benefits of bicycles in Africa. The volunteers interviewed people and discussed how bicycles affected their life and transform their everyday activities.

In November of 2018, Wheels to Africa partnered with J.J. Barea Foundation to bike 375 bicycles to Puerto Rico and donated a 40-foot container to the community. The container was turned into a library and community center and the bicycles were donated to needy communities. Eight US volunteers

spent five days preparing bicycles for the communities and donating them to various groups.

In 2019, Wheels to Africa hosted 18 volunteers from two California families for a two-week volunteer experience to include volunteering in schools, visiting and donating to a Maasai Village, touring the Serengeti, and engaging with local youth during community activities.

The COVID years had been challenging because shipping cost tripled and so bicycles were donated to displaced workers and sold inexpensively so everyone who needy a bicycle could have one. During in the height of COVID there were no bicycles or supplies in most retail stores so Wheels to Africa meet the community demand by selling a few bicycles. Due to increased shipping cost, Wheels to Africa has incurred rental expenses that were not part of the "normal" budget expenses so we are seeking monetary donations and ideas about storage of bicycles.

In April of 2021 we shipped our 2020 bicycles to Tanzania and we transformed a Maasai Village school in July of 2021. We repaired desks and doors at a school and set up the first library in the village at the school. We fixed the toilet and repaired the roof and donated recreational equipment.

Wheels to Africa has been participating in the Certified Federal Campaign (CFC) (Government Giving Platform) for many 10 years. Prior to COVID and currently, we participate in charity fairs to share our mission with government employees. CFC 90290


Your Glencarlyn Neighbors!



The graph below shows home price growth has moderated in recent months as buyer demand has slowed in response to higher mortgage rates. While home price growth is moderating month-over-month, the percent of appreciation year-over-year is still well above the home price change we saw during more normal years in the market. The bars for January 2019 through mid-2020 show home price appreciation around 3-4% a year was more typical (see bars for January 2019 through mid-2020). The latest data for this year shows prices have still climbed by roughly 10% over last year. Inventory is still low compared to more normal years. For a potential home seller, that means your house should still be in demand for potential buyers if you price it right.


