VHC Health and Arlington County Shape Plans for 601 S. Carlin Springs Road

In late January 2023, VHC Health (formerly Virginia Hospital Center) and Arlington County announced a draft agreement to build a mental health and rehabilitation facility on South Carlin Springs Road at the site of the former Emergency Clinic / Doctors' Hospital of Northern Virginia.

VHC Health proposes repurchasing 5.8 acres of the site and the remaining property would continue to be owned by Arlington County. VHC Health would reimburse the county for the demolition work on the property and preparing it for new construction.

From multiple meetings with VHC Health and Arlington County Board and Staff members, the Glencarlyn Civic Association (GCA) has learned more about VHC's potential plan for the site and the draft timeline for review, public comment, and zoning approval.

The county and VHC Health's goal is for site approval in fall 2023 and construction to potentially begin in late 2023/early 2024 with opening of the facility in 2025. Between now and site approval, a committee will be formed by the Arlington County Planning Commission to review the site application and plan.

At present time, VHC Health envisions a single floor building with 72 beds dedicated to mental health and substance use recovery. This consists of a 24-bed adult unit, a 24-bed youth unit, a 24-bed "recovery and wellness unit" and five outpatient programs.

It will also have 40 beds set aside for people with brain and spinal cord injuries, those recovering from strokes and those with neurological and other conditions. Currently, the main VHC campus has 20 beds for patients with these needs according to an article published on the website ARLNOW.com.

The major concerns brought forth by Glencarlyn and Forest Glen residents at three meetings include site security, increased vehicle traffic along Carlin Springs Road, maintaining the resource protection area and natural areas, and future use of the remaining county owned property.

"Slaying" the Mountain

As I write this, I am in Colorado skiing. Some days my physical strength and technical skills allow me to absolutely "slay" the mountain. I feel like Michaela Shiffrin, the most decorated skier in the world. Then there are those days, no matter how hard I try, the mountain wins. But I love it and I never give up. That is how I feel about serving as president of your GCA. Some days I "slay it" and some days the mountain wins. But I never give up.

By the time you read this, the County Board will have voted on their Missing Middle Housing plan. As you know, I oppose the plan. No matter which side you support, however, know that I have worked to show the County inconsistencies, and flawed or no data, which will hurt smaller neighborhoods like Glencarlyn.

GCA is working with the County and VHC Health **to ensure that we have a voice in plans for the Behavioral Health and Wellness Facility** which will be built adjacent to our community. We have had two information sessions, one virtual and one in person. We will continue to speak up and emphasize the concerns and recommendations of Glencarlyn.

Along that same vein, ALL of the presidents of civic associations bordering **Carlin Springs Rd** are strongly urging the County Board to **push up the start date of the CIP Traffic Safety Study**, rather than wait until FY 25.

In the second half of 2023, the County Manager's Office and Arlington Public Library leadership will engage with all Arlington communities in a long-term strategic discussion about "how to best provide library services in a changing environment." The Manager's report states, "Using data and an equity lens framework, the strategic discussion will look at how current and future library services and locations can best meet the needs of all Arlington residents." This discussion will include "how to prioritize competing needs of new locations and established locations." I am certain that our Glencarlyn Branch Library is in danger of budget cuts, or worse. We must once again rally the troops and remind the County Board which communities our library serves.

Recognizing the need to promote more community inclusion, we have been working to schedule a community event on the west side of Carlin Springs Rd. We have run into a few hurdles- parks and rec scheduling, Kenmore facilities, and special events permitting. However, I think I can safely say we will hold a Glencarlyn Community "Movie on the Green" on Sat., April 29th on Kenmore Middle School grounds, with food trucks providing dinner and movie treats.

All of the above does not happen without hard work. And the commitment of community members. GCA needs a secretary for the coming year. And very importantly, we are looking for an Editor for the Village View, the longest continually published community newsletter in Arlington.

Please step forward and help our community. Together we can slay the mountain.

During each of the meetings, Adrian Stanton, VHC Health's VP of Business Development & Community Relations, emphasized that the initial site drawing included in the letter of intent with the County was just a potential "test fit" of the site and not a final design or floorplan.

VHC Health's staff stated that neither the site security plan nor construction plans have been put into place, as they are still in the drafting process. They have promised to continue to meet with residents during the planning and construction process. Mr. Stanton has vowed to keep all channels of communication open with community leaders.

Jill Hunger, Assistant Director, Department of Community Planning, Housing & Development at Arlington County, reiterated that there is no plan yet for use of the remaining County property, and whatever is planned will be in partnership with VHC Health and compatible with the existing landscape and Long Branch Nature Center. She would not confirm or deny potential relocation or expansion of the Animal Welfare League of Arlington at the site nor how the county intends to connect whatever is built with Long Branch Nature Center.

The GCA and Forest Glen community leaders vow to remain vigilant and advocate for our communities' wellbeing and safety while understanding the critical need for additional mental health care facilities in Arlington County.

Time is running out to submit your name for the 2023–24 GCA Executive Committee! At the April 10 meeting, the Nominating Committee will present at least one candidate for each office—president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and *Village View* editor—along with delegates and alternates to the Arlington County Civic Federation (ACCF) and the Arlington Neighborhoods Program Advisory Committee.

We have several incumbents who are willing to be nominated again for their positions but are also willing to yield to others who step forward.

A member of the Nominating Committee will get in touch with you and answer any questions you may have.

The slate of nominees will be announced at the April 10 GCA meeting. The names will be published in the May *Village View* and/or Glencarlyn email updates before the May 1 meeting, during which the election will be held.

Interested GCA members not on the slate presented by the Nominating Committee can nominate themselves or be nominated by someone else from the floor during that meeting. (Members nominated by someone else must confirm—either in person or in writing—their willingness to stand for election and commitment to serve if elected.)

Any individual residing in Glencarlyn is eligible for membership and election to a position. Candidates and voters must be current members of the GCA to run. The term of office begins on July 1 and runs through June 30, 2024.

We'll offer free colonial era sweet treats and you'll can tour the oldest house in Arlington. Be transported back to the sights and sounds of Arlington's earliest days.



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
April 22: George Washington's Forest Guided History Walk (1:30 pm)

Arlington Neighborhoods Program (ANP) Update

Engineering and Design Work Proceeds on Kenmore Wooded Area Project

This project will improve the wooded area at the west end of the Kenmore Middle School property, as well as the S. Manchester St. entrance and frontage, the 2nd St. S. dead end, and the east side of S. Manchester St.

Engineers are ordering test holes for verifying underground utilities locations. The Parks Department landscape architect will work on the project designs until a replacement ANP staff architect is hired.

Once the design information is available, there will be refinement of the draft plan, as was anticipated when the project was approved and funded. Some items that GCA proposed may need to go into a future AN project or be pursued by collaboration between APS and GCA. As the plan is refined, more information will be provided about the scope of the project.

IPC, the invasive control contractor hired by Arlington County, will complete the three remaining invasive treatments during summer and fall of 2023, and summer of 2024. Signs will be posted when the treatments take place and the area being treated will be safe to enter.

Wetland Studies and Solutions, a consulting firm hired by the county, has completed a tree survey. The plan is to evaluate existing trees for removal, pruning or retention once the invasive treatments are complete.

View from the Garden

Digging into the Library Garden Story

Once upon a time... there was no gazebo, no benches, no herb beds, no signage, no pots. After an initial renovation by Josh Davis and his Boy Scout Troop in 1990, the garden area behind the Library had fallen into disrepair. By 1999, when it rained, the garden area looked like this:



Can you believe that is what the garden area actually looked like back in 1999!

Two longtime residents, Judy Funderburk and Paul Nuhn, both trained as Extension Master Gardeners, began to invest time and energy into the garden's rejuvenation. The Cvic Association, upon learning of the County's Small Parks Grant availability, asked Judy to write a grant application. With the help of Nancy Davis and Sherry Malley, a 41-page application was submitted, and on May 7, 2001 we were ecstatic to learn we had been approved to receive a grant of \$5,654! Entry arches, Glencarlyn Library Community Garden signs, two park benches, improved drainage, cisterns, and horticultural plant signage followed.

Meanwhile long-time Glencarlynite Sue Zajac offered to fund the cost of a gazebo in honor of her late husband Leo, who loved the Library and had always wanted a gazebo. With the help of neighborhood builder/contractor Sam Celia, a community gazebo raising took place.



The gazebo raising picture was taken by Paul Nuhn back in February 2002, an era before I-phones.

As the garden grew, so did the need for help with upkeep. Paul and Judy applied for and were approved to become a Virginia Cooperative Extension and Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia (MGNV) teaching/demonstration garden in 2004/2005. Now almost 20 years later, five Extension Master Gardeners are co-coordinators, dedicating many of their volunteer hours to upkeep of and teaching through the library garden, plus organizing weekly work parties where we are joined by many



other MG volunteers. Throughout the summer neighborhood volunteers take on the responsibility of watering one of 10 designated garden areas. We could not do it without them.

The garden provides hundreds of examples of the botanical diversity and gardening choices available here in Northern Virginia. Most of our plantings have informative signage so that identification is available even when we are not physically present. Walk through and notice the beds dedicated to herbs: Culinary, Fragrant, Medicinal. Enjoy the Sun and Shade gardens, a wooded area devoted to native plants, an Asian garden, a parking lot garden where sun-loving and drought tolerant mostly native plants greet our visitors who arrive by car. Take note of the Children's Garden on the other side of the back fence. It provides the Carlin Hall Pre-Schoolers with opportunities to learn about seeds, bulbs, potting, transplanting, watering and growing a garden.

A major focus of the Library Garden is providing habitat for wildlife. It has been recognized as a <u>Certified Wildlife Habitat</u>® by the National Wildlife Federation, certified as an official Monarch Waystation by <u>Monarch Watch.org.</u>, and confirmed as an <u>Audubon at Home Wildlife Sanctuary</u>. Climateconscious sustainable gardening practices are demonstrated through the use of cisterns, timers, drip hoses, wood chip paths, and reduction of lawn.

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
