President's Corner

Two years and several months after the initial letter of intent between VHC Health and Arlington County, the official site plan submission and review process has begun.

Community members from Glencarlyn and neighboring civic associations are involved with the official SPRC process as well as informal conversations and requests with county officials and staff. Below is an update on both the SPRC process and lol back at the overall project.

Community Update: Virginia Hospital Center Site Plan Review Process Begins

On Friday, October 10, 2025, representatives from Arlington County and the Site Plan Review Committee (SPRC) met with community leaders to discuss the upcoming review process for the Virginia Hospital Center (VHC) Health Wellness & Behavioral Health Facility site plan and use permit applications. This initial meeting served as a valuable opportunity to walk through the review process and hear early feedback from stakeholders.

Attended the meeting on behalf of the local community was Brandon Hemel, GCA President, Marti Mefford, Forest Glen Civic Association President, and Omari Davis, Forest Glen Civic Association President.

During this meeting, the Civic Association Presidents reiterated these key points

- No Second Entrance / Egress onto S. Carlin Springs Rd. We have worked with the county on ways to reduce traffic and improve safety on S. Carlin Springs Road. Morning traffic is still backed up from Rt 50 to south of Campbell ES - adding more traffic and a second entryway/egress is a step backwards in our progress.
- The construction and operations of the Wellness Hospital must minimize the impact on adjoining neighborhoods (Glencarlyn, Forest Glen, Arlington Mill), schools on Carlin Springs Rd (both in their daily operations and students travelling to and from schools), the resource protection area (including the Moses Ball Spring), and Long Branch Nature Center.
- Operational safety and security must be addressed and enhanced due to location near schools and neighborhoods.
- Reconsideration of the massing, footprint, and orientation to reduce limitation on potential use of county land and easement as well as impact on surrounding land and uses.
- Lighting on property - especially due to light spillage from front of building and entryway / exit ways during evening and predawn hours. Current orientation focuses light spillage towards residences on 5th Road South.
- Further clarification on why VHC Health and the County agreed to siting the Wellness Hospital on this property, the division of the site between VHC and Arlington County, the terms of the potential long-term lease, AND the county's planned usage of the remaining property.



We specifically stated that we understand the county's need for the Wellness Hospital and commitment to providing support to the greater Arlington community, but the building and operations must be appropriate for our community.

Site Plan Review Process & Community Engagement

Status:

The VHC Health site plan has been submitted but is not yet approved as of October 10. County Representatives reiterated that documents online are preliminary. Submitted plans are available on the county website: tinyurl.com/vhcinnov25w

Timeline:

Fall 2025: VHC Health's site plan is still in interdepartmental review, once that is complete, the site plan review committee will be formed. Arlington County will start the public commit process with an online portal to capture concerns from the community and stakeholders.

Fall-Winter 2025: Site Plan Review Committee Meetings: SPRC Meetings led by Planning Commissioners to discuss topics related to the plans

Winter 2025-Spring 2026: County Commission Meetings. Package of proposal items is heard by commission meetings including Transportation, Planning, etc.

Spring: 2026: County Board Meeting to act on the site plan application and conditions.

VHC Health now aims to break ground in 2026, with construction expected in 2027/2028.

Each neighborhood will have a primary and alternate SPRC

representative. SPRC Meetings will be held in person or virtually, with recordings and public comment opportunities available.

While LEED certification is not required, each building plan must include a *Sustainability Commit Form*.

Project Overview: New Rehabilitation and Behavioral Wellness Facility at Carlin Springs

In 2023, Arlington County and VHC Health outlined the vision for a new, modern rehabilitation and behavioral health facility at 601 S. Carlin Springs Rd. Key highlights include:

A letter of intent between Arlington County and VHC Health allows VHC to repurchase half of the original Carlin Springs site to build a state-of-the-art facility supporting both inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation, as well as behavioral health and wellness programs. This repurchase has now be adjusted to be a long-term land lease.

The project responds to a growing local and national demand for behavioral health services, especially for adolescents. For the first time, Arlington will have the opportunity to offer both inpatient and outpatient adolescent behavioral health services.

View from the Garden

Narcissus 'Carlton'

Just when you think that your garden chores are done for the year, it's time to plant your spring bulbs, namely daffodils. But before we discuss the details of planting spring bulbs let me fill you in on a little history.

Daffodil is the common name of plants in the genus *Narcissus* and is native to southwest Europe and northern Africa. The *Narcissus* name originated from Greek mythology. There is evidence that the Romans were responsible for introducing the daffodil to Britain. The flower continued its popularity through the 19th century, and soon the flower was cultivated for its aesthetic qualities especially the unique trumpet shape.

The *Narcissus* cultivars are divided into 13 divisions based on flower form, number of flowers per stem and flowering period. There are over 27,000 registered names, each assigned a division and a color code. If you think daffodils are all yellow you might be surprised to know the colors include white, pink, orange, and cream. One of the most popular yellow large cupped daffodils is the

Carlton, dating to 1927. Ice Follies, the most popular white daffodil is also a large cupped flower with a touch of yellow, introduced in 1953.

Tips for Planting Daffodils

Once the soil has cooled but not frozen, it's time to plant your bulbs. In this area you can usually plant into December. The plant likes a sunny location but does tolerate partial shade. If you get early daffodils you should keep in mind that they will bloom before the leaves come out on the trees, so they can be planted in areas that will be shady later in the spring.

The bulbs should be planed about 6 inches deep and 4-6 inches apart with the pointy side up. For the best results they should be planted in clumps of 3-6 bulbs. They can be naturalized in lawns but the leaves should not be mowed or cut until after they start to fade and turn yellow.

Cover the bulbs with dirt and stamp down the soil. The bulbs are rodent resistant, and the plants are also deer resistant. The bulbs need to develop roots before the ground freezes, so watering is important if there is no rain.

But, if you are not inspired to plant your own bulbs, come see the daffodils in the Glencarlyn Library garden or in the garden at the Ball-Sellers house.

Arlington Neighborhoods Program (ANP) Update

Manchester St. and 2nd St. S. – Construction timeline not available until contract is advertised and awarded

This funded project will improve the wooded area at the west end of the Kenmore Middle School property, as well as the S. Manchester St. entrance and frontage, the 2nd St. S. dead end, and the east side of S. Manchester St. Ryan Donlon, whose home is adjacent to the project area, is the block representative.

Construction continues to be estimated for later this year or next spring, but a clear construction timeline is not yet available. The procurement package is still being prepared, to be followed by the advertising process. All property easements have been acquired.

County staff finalized a landscape owner's manual for the 2nd St S & S Manchester pollinator garden. It will provide volunteers and interested residents with general and seasonal specific maintenance, including guidelines and facts for each plant. Staff finalized the text for the garden's educational signage. They will also launch a website once the educational signage is installed. This website will provide garden and maintenance information, including translations, via a QR code on the signage.

IPC, the invasive control contractor hired by Arlington County, completed the fall treatment at the end of September. One more treatment is left and will take place during summer 2026. Wetland Studies and Solutions, a consulting firm hired by the county, has completed a tree survey. They will evaluate trees for removal, pruning or retention once the invasive treatments are complete.

Neighborhood Signs Replacement and Relocation – Decision soon on S. Manchester St. sign relocation.

The old neighborhood signs at Arlington Blvd./S. Carlin Springs Rd., and at 5th Rd. S./ S. Carlin Springs Rd have been replaced with new signs using the same design.

The old sign located at S. Manchester St./ Arlington Blvd. will be replaced and relocated. The ANP planner met with neighborhood representatives in September and identified two potential locations. Once the location is selected, the permitting process will get underway.

Replacement project for Moses Ball Spring still being evaluated

A different project to replace the proposed Moses Ball Spring (MBS) area restoration and improvement ANP project is still being evaluated. As explained in the September Village View, ANP staff will not be able to consider the MBS area for project work at this time. Further information about the replacement project will be available in November.

Help needed with mowing and planting maintenance in several Glencarlyn areas

Volunteers are needed to help with mowing and caring for the meadow circle trail at the 5th St. S. and S. Illinois entrance to Long Branch Nature Center, and with mowing, weeding, planting and other maintenance around the three neighborhood signs. For many years, one neighbor has performed most of this work and is ready to share his knowledge and pass on the responsibility. With installation of the new neighborhood signs, it's a perfect time to address these needs.

Highlighted in a 2023 meeting between VHC Health and Arlington County rising mental health needs, with Virginia ranked 38th overall (and 48th for youth) in access to care. Local data shows increasing demand for crisis services and a troubling rise in opioid overdoses.

The new facility will provide:

- 146 total beds, including:
 - 36-bed adolescent behavioral health unit (new)
 - 36-bed adult behavioral health unit (expanded)
 - 24-bed recovery & wellness unit (expanded)
 - 50-bed inpatient rehabilitation unit for brain/spinal cord injuries, stroke, and neurological conditions
- Five outpatient programs, including intensive outpatient and partial hospitalization options for both adults and adolescents.

Arlington County will retain half of the property for future public uses while maintaining natural landscaping and scenic easements in the interim.

Advocacy for the Moses Ball Spring

Situated on the northeastern corner of the 601 property is the Moses Ball Spring, a neglected pre-colonial historical site indicated by only a small stream house built by the glencarlyn community and a historical marker on S. Carlin Springs Road.

County DES staff are working on a high priority repair at the Long Branch stream outfall on the south side of S. Jefferson St. intersection of 5th Rd. S. The Long Branch outfall is a high priority for repair due to severe active erosion and broken and damaged stormwater pipes. The project will create a stable

outfall, repair infrastructure, stabilize an 8-foot drop in the stream channel, remove invasives and plant native plants, and recreate the connection from the Moses Ball Spring to the stream.

This project is in design phase; timeline is still being determined but work may begin in Winter 2025/2026. For more information on this project, please visit tinyurl.com/mosesn25w

Concurrently, a group of neighbors have written to the Arlington County Board to push for an archeological review of the land surround the spring and the parking lot area of the northern portion of the site.

From their letter:

We believe the retained site offers a unique opportunity to unearth a more complete history of Arlington from the early Native American presence, through colonial settlement, to early 20th century residential development. Although information about the site is available from a variety of sources, additional archeological information may be hidden beneath the parking lot, in land that has not been disturbed in more than six decades, providing a rare opportunity to open a time capsule from the past.

Available information about the site includes discovery of 8500-year-old LeCroy points near the Moses Ball Spring, contemporaneous written accounts and maps, published historical articles and books, and research into land records. Although this information is relevant and important, there does not appear to be a definitive history of the site that gathers the existing information, carries it through to the present day, and validates the sources.

Continuing evaluation and newer technology may help validate current sources and uncover additional information about the site. For example, although written accounts and records document the existence of the Moses Ball house circa the 1750s, a mill and a family burial site, the exact locations have not been confirmed and made part of public history. Newer technology could help confirm the locations, including possible unmarked graves. In addition to the family burial site, there is a known but unprotected cemetery west of the site that should be properly acknowledged and protected.

The GCA has endorsed this letter and efforts to preserve our local history.

The idiom Many Hands Make Light Work is absolutely true here as there is not one single person but a partnership of efforts of multiple Glencarlyn residents and volunteers over many, many years. Those who have given their time and sweat equity to make Glencarlyn a better place.
